Free Play Time

The job of our children is to play! How does your child like to play? During this time, allow your child to play as they see fit. Extend their thinking by asking them open-ended questions to learn more about their thought processes. Remember, less is more for children. Prepare a few “baskets” of activities and let them choose one and after, they can put it away to exchange for a new one.

Ask your child questions such as:

- How do you know?
- Why did you decide to do that?
- What do you think will happen next?
- Can you think of another way to do this?
- Is there anything else you could use?
